

LEED Information

The U.S. Green Building Council (USGBC) has developed the LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) Green Building Rating System. This System provides a definitive national standard for what constitutes a "green building". No product or building material may be accurately classified as "LEED certified." The LEED rating system was designed to classify entire building projects. Building materials may provide "points" toward the LEED status of your project.

Total Doors may provide points for your LEED project in the following categories according to LEED version 2.2.

Credit 4.1 & 4.2 – Recycled Content – (2 points)

25% Recycled content in our steel

80% Post Consumer content

20% Post Industrial

(Average weight = 100 lbs. approximately 22.5% of total product weight.)

Credit 5.1 & 5.2 – Regional materials – (2 points)

Project must be within 500 miles of the manufacturing plant — Waterford, MI

Wood Reinforcement – Grayling, MI (173 miles)

Steel – Rouge, MI (31 miles)

Polystyrene cores – Byron Center, MI (148 miles)

Paint – Columbus, OH (236 miles)

Wood Veneer – Jeffersonville, IN (384 miles)

Credit 7 – Certified Wood – (1 point)
